THE COUNTY OF CUMBRIA (C1035 HOWMILL, BRAMPTON) (TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 2023

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that to enable Network Rail to carry out drainage works ("the Works"), the County Council of Cumbria intends to make an Order the effect of which is to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding along that section of the C1035 Howmill, Brampton from its junction with the U1197 extending in a south easterly direction for a distance of approx. 65m.

A way for pedestrians and dismounted cyclists will be maintained at all times and a suitable alternative route for vehicles will be signed and available via the unrestricted section of the C1035, C1026, U1195, U1196 and U1197.

Nothing in the Order to which this notice relates shall:

- 1. Apply to emergency service vehicles, or vehicles being used by statutory undertakers in the performance of their duties; and
- 2. Apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; and
- Have the effect of preventing at any time access for pedestrians to any premises situated on or adjacent to the road, or to any other premises accessible for pedestrians from, and only from the road; and
- 4. Apply to vehicles being used in connection with the Works.

The Order will come into operation on 26 March 2023 and may continue in force for a maximum duration of eighteen months. However, please note that it is anticipated that the restriction will only be required for **5 days** and only as and when the appropriate traffic signs are displayed.
