TEMPORARY ORDER 2025

Kent County Council works.

To allow highway improvement works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of A229 Cranbrook Road, Hawkhurst.

A closure is planned from 31st March 2025, with estimated completion by 6th May 2025, or where stated on a valid Permit (GE27877518219-02 - Kent County Council). The scheduled dates may vary for these works with appropriate signage displayed on site and the works will be displayed on [One.Network](#)

A229 Cranbrook Road will be closed outside Hill Crest. To the extent indicated by signs and barriers on site.

The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce to allow highway improvement works to be carried out, works are undertaken by Kent County Council.

The alternative route for any through traffic is via A229 Cranbrook Road, A229 Gills Green, A229 Hawkhurst Road, A229 Hartley Road, A229 Angley Road, A229 Wisley Green, A229 Wilsley Pound, A262 Goudhurst Road, A262 Cranbrook Road, A262 Church Road, A262 High Street, A262 The Plain, A262 West Road, A262 Clayhill, A262 Station Road, A262 Spelmonden Road, A262 Goudhurst Road, A262 Horsmonden Road, A21 Forstal Farm Roundabout, A21 Lamberhurst Bypass, A21 Scotney Castle Roundabout, A21 Hastings Road, A21 London Road, A268 Hawkhurst Road, A268 High Street, A229 Rye Road, A229 Cranbrook Road and vice versa.

Pedestrian access will be maintained during the works.
