Notice is hereby given that on 9th July 2021 Somerset County Council made the above Order in exercise of the provisions of Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as previously advertised on the 1st July 2021 to introduce temporary traffic restrictions in the roads specified in the Schedules below.

The Works are expected to commence on 19th July 2021 until 22nd July 2021 and the restrictions will only apply when indicated by traffic signs.
