

CUMBERLAND COUNCIL (C1035 HOW MILL AND B6413 BRAMPTON FELL) (LEVEL CROSSINGS) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF ALL TRAFFIC) ORDER 2025

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that to enable level crossing works to be carried out (“the Works”), Cumberland Council intends to make an Order the effect of which is to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding along the following sections of road:

1. C1035 How Mill, which extends for a distance of approx. 30m either side of the centre line of How Mill Level Crossing.

Alternative Route: via the unrestricted sections of the C1035, Faugh, C1026, Heads Nook, U1195, U1196 Fenton and U1197.

Duration: From 2200 hours on Sunday 22 March to 0530 hours on Monday 23 March 2026 (Ref: TTROC/15960).

2. B6413, Brampton Fell, which extends for a distance of approx. 20 metres either side of Brampton Fell Level Crossing.

Alternative Route: via the unrestricted sections of the B6413, C1031 Talkin, C1032 Milton, A689, A69, C1046, Capon Tree Road, Paving Brow, and Tarn Road, Brampton.

Duration: From 2359 hours on Monday 23 March 2026 to 0530 hours on Tuesday 24 March 2026 (Ref: TTROC/15961).

The Order will come into operation on 22 March 2026 and may continue in force for a maximum duration of eighteen months. However, please note that it is anticipated that the restrictions will only be required as detailed above, and only as and when the appropriate traffic signs are displayed.
